


## What is the NHWDS


### Registration renewal

Practitioners renew their registration each year during the three-month period aligning with their profession's annual registration renewal period. Nurses and midwives renewal period is 1 April -31 May (with an additional one month grace to end of June)



# Workforce survey

The Department **of** Health (DoH) maintains questionnaires, specific to each of the registered professions, containing workforce related questions. These questionnaires are known as the "workforce survey".

### **Review of content**

- Reviewed periodically
- All professions currently undergoing review for implementation in 2021 registration renewal
- Changes or additions must strictly be related to the intended use for workforce planning purposes
- Review is undertaken in conjunction with a committee of stakeholders, for nursing and midwifery this includes:
  - The Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia
  - Ahpra
  - Jurisdictional workforce planners
  - DoH Chief Nursing and Midwifery Office
  - Health Workforce Division






### Employed (excluding those on long leave), 2013 - 2019




### Employed (excluding those on long leave) - state and territory, 2019




### Employed (excluding those on long leave) - FTE per 100,000 population, 2019






### Employed (excluding those on long leave) - FTE per 100,000 population, 2019
